The numbers of participants per country provided in the table are based on the lists of participants interviewed within the feasibility study, attendees of the internal meeting on March 19th and attendees of the final Webinar on April 23rd (each person was counted once, even if they participated in multiple activities).

- Description of the WP and its activities.

This Work Package consisted of a group of related activities with the aim to plan the next steps of the NETCO project:

1. **Feasibility study: follow-up of the NETCO project** which engaged 20 participants from 11 countries
2. **Internal NETCO members meeting (March 19th 2024)** which engaged 17 participants from 10 countries
3. NETCO follow-up survey on Collaborative Housing and the NETCO Report (2023-2024 Peer Exchanges & Policy Recommendations) which engaged all the project partners
4. **Free public online Webinar (April 23rd 2024)** which engaged 180 participants from 44 countries

Ad 1 Feasibility study: follow-up of the NETCO project

SAGOResearch was contracted in December 2023 by the project leader to carry out a feasibility study about the follow-up of the NETCO project, to turn it into a more sustainable format/ structure. During February and March 2024, 20 people were interviewed from 14 public authorities, civil society organisations and intermediaries engaged in the NETCO project in order to discuss:

- Is it possible to transform the NETCO project into a more sustainable initiative/structure? Is there a need, appetite, interest? What would be the added value?
- What conditions are necessary to make this happen (human, financial, technical, time)?
- What are the necessary conditions? (objectives, structure, membership, governance and management, financial resources, working structures)
- What are the strengths of NETCO that should be maintained? What are the weaknesses of NETCO to be avoided?
- What are the opportunities and threats to help to support/hinder a more sustainable structure for the NETCO project?

The interviews were accompanied by desk research and benchmark study of NETCO.

Ad 2 Internal NETCO members meeting (March 19th 2024)

The results of the feasibility study were discussed during the internal NETCO members meeting on March 19th. Majority of current project partners show interest in continuation of the network. Scope of engagement will however depend on specific conditions, e.g. only a group of cities/regions have capacity to contribute financially (to a varying degree).

The study identified the most probable structure of aims of the NETCO project in its next phase:

Ad 4 Free public online Webinar (April 23rd 2024)

Main takeaways from the Webinar:

- Collaborative Housing is seen differently by the Local and Regional Governments (LGR) from NETCO. While many of them see this as partnerships with civil society to achieve more innovative affordable housing (where public support can take the form of land leases, grants and loans), others see it as an alternative market-price practice by different stakeholders (cohousing groups, private developers) that can be encouraged through a preferential allocation of land for purchase in new developments.
- In addition to the cultural and political orientation between these approaches, another element highlighted in the webinar is the availability of public land that can be leased (e.g. in Barcelona) or the absence of public land which reduces the capacity of municipalities to foster affordable Collaborative Housing development (e.g. Oslo). In between, an approach of recognising Community-developers as eligible to social housing financing allows for alternative forms of tenure and housing with the guarantee of the public interest (e.g. the Community Land Trust Brussels, supported by Brussels Capital Region).
- NETCO acknowledges the diversity of Cities and sees this as a strength to exchange about policies and strategies to promote Collaborative Housing. As political orientations can change at each local election, it is interesting for public servants to see what solutions can be put in place, or not, with different governments and political interests.
- Based on the best practice of the members, the NETCO final report formulates 15 recommendations (10 for Local and Regional Governments, and 5 for the EU), some of which were highlighted during the Webinar.
- With 180 participants from 44 countries to the webinar, it is clear that Collaborative Housing has become a topic of interest in Europe and beyond both for civil society and LGR. NETCO is willing to become a permanent network of European LRG to foster knowledge sharing among them and with partners from civil society and academia.
