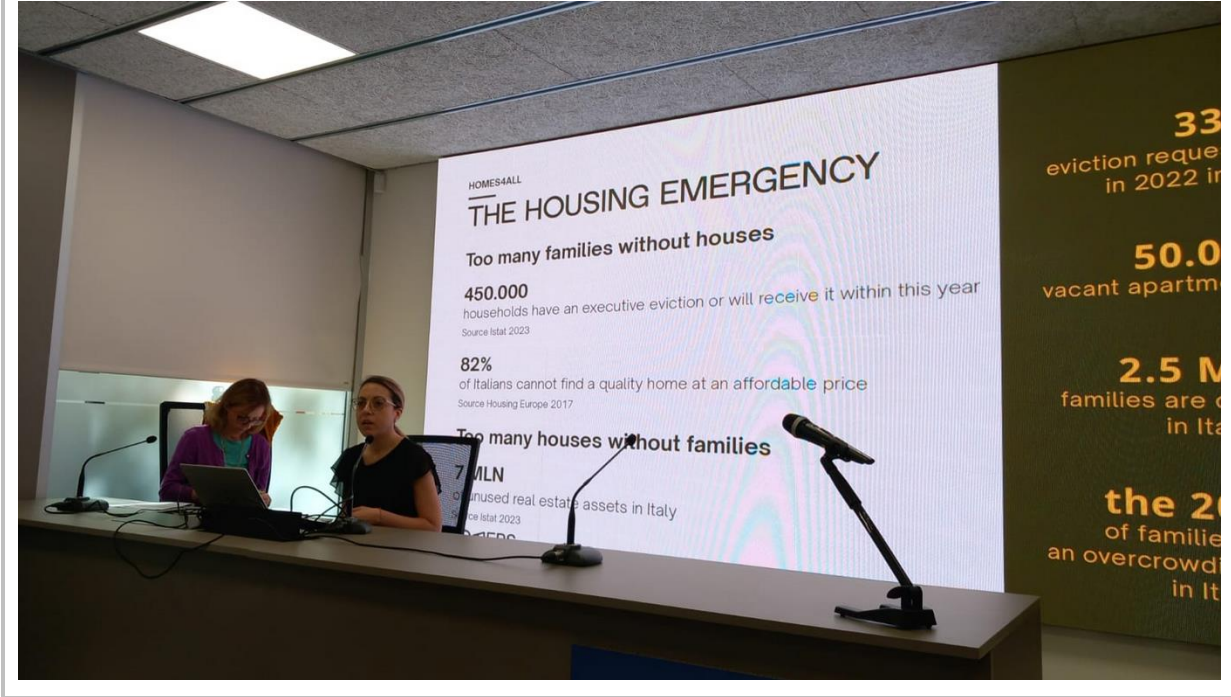

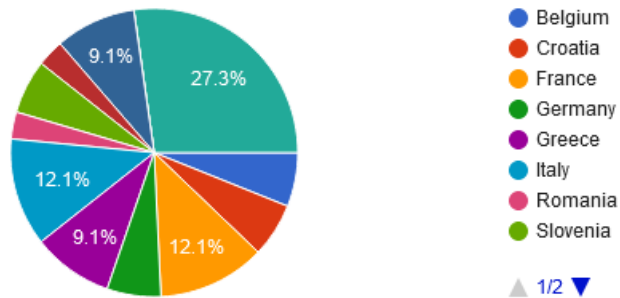


Registrations to the event per country and gender:

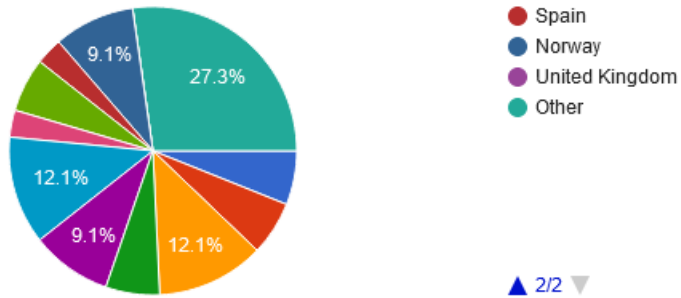

1. Which country do you represent?

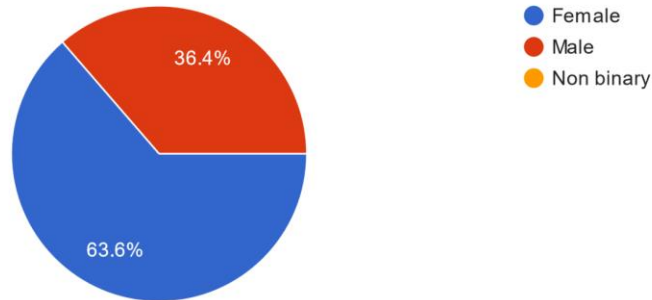

2. What is your gender?

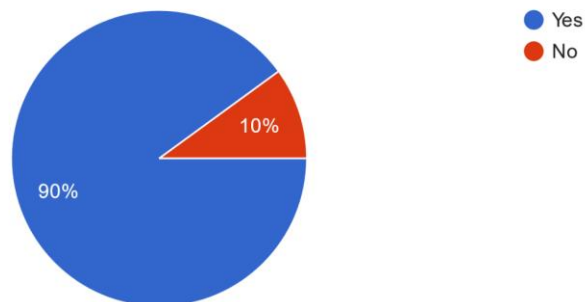

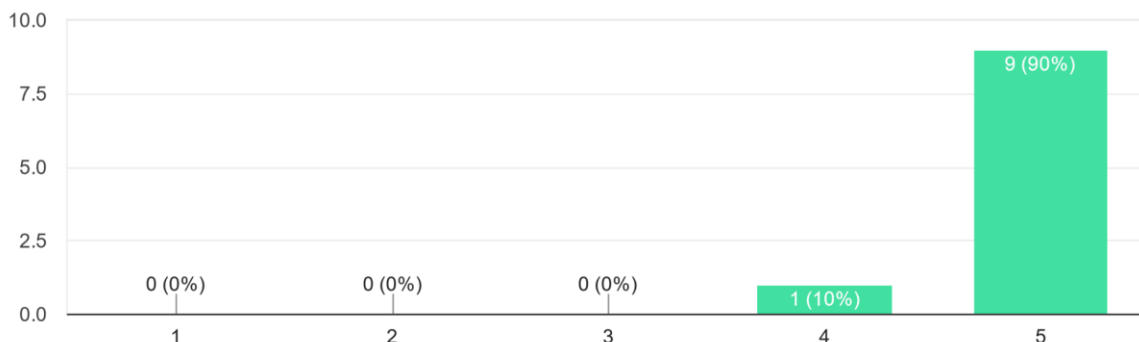
2. Do you represent any of the formal project partners?

Generally speaking, the partners who answered the questionnaire, sent very positive feedback on the event. In particular, the visits to the three different cohousing projects and a good balance between visits/ presentations/ workshops. The partners appreciated the fact of the NECTO event being a part of the ISHF, as well as Site visits and Netco partners meetings (case studies), collaborative-housing projects presentations (specific examples), ISHF roundtable: "Financial enablers of new housing cooperatives".

Also the dialogue among the partners was highly valued. As one respondent said: "It was very inspiring to be able to connect with European partners on such an in-depth level. For the future, I would have wanted to focus more on discussing possibilities for collaborations or dividing the groups more based on topics, to get more structured discussions". Suggestions in order to improve the event consisted above all in the request **to give more space to moments of exchange and debate between partners**.

The themes that emerged with greater force to be explored in future debates concern:

- How can cities (municipalities) help and urge cooperative and collaborative housing;
- How (to help) to finance co-housing projects ? How to implement them without a bottom up situation;
- Collaborative housing projects coupled with building renovation;
- Social impact of collaborative housing;
- How to set up collaborations and how to start new projects.
