Description

- Description of the event and its activities:

The event was divided into two and a half days, starting on April 12 and ending on April 14 2023 in the early afternoon.

A welcome dinner was held on 12 April in which the Vice Mayor Emily Marion Clancy presented the housing situation of the city of Bologna and the Netco coordinator, Maite Arrondo, recalled the purpose of the project.

The second day was divided into two work sessions dedicated to discussions between partners on the topic of the legal framework of cohousing. In the morning the cases of Bologna, Barcelona, Amsterdam and Berlin were presented, giving space for questions and debate with the other project partners. The afternoon was dedicated to visiting 3 specific cases of cohousing to highlight how the legal framework developed in Bologna allows for the creation of collaborative housing models adaptable to a wide range of social, economic and urban planning needs.

The last day was dedicated to the open event about collaborative housing. The event took place in the historical building Salal Borsa in Piazza Maggiore. More than one hundred people attended the conference.

The conference was opened by the Vice Mayor Emily Marion Clancy who presented the plan for collaborative housing in Bologna. Then followed a speech by Vanesa Valiño, Head of Cabinet of the Housing and Rehabilitation Department of the City of Barcelona illustrating Barcelona models. Phd Michael LaFond of the Id22 Institute for Creative Sustainability in Berlin and scientific coordinator of the project, presented the Netco research. Raffaele Laudani, Councilor for Urban Planning of the Municipality of Bologna, illustrated the strategies of Bologna as a collaborative city. Then the Director of the Planning Office, Francesco Evangelisti presented the urbanistic tools and regulations related to the new collaborative forms of dwelling. The researcher of the University of Bologna, Manuela Maggio, presented the results of the social report on the cohousing Porto 15 five years after its opening. The works were closed with speeches by Liat Rogel, Director of the Impact Housing Foundation of Milan on the state of the art of cohousing in Italy and its possible future scenarios and by Professor Carlo Cellamare of the University of Rome-La Sapienza on bottom up urban self-organisation experiences.

The meeting was moderated by the Director of the Housing Policies of the Municipality of Bologna, Marco Guerzoni.




Registrations to the event per country:

1. Which country do you represent? / Da dove vieni?






Feedback collected from NETCO partners who were asked to evaluate the event:

Generally speaking, the partners who answered the questionnaire, sent very positive feedback on the event. In particular, the visits to the three different cohousings and the direct dialogue with the residents were considered by many partners as the highlight of the event because they could visualise the topics discussed in the project. Also the dialogue among the partners was highly valued. The models of collaborative housing described by Bologna, Barcelona, Amsterdam and Berlincities have aroused interest.

Suggestions in order to improve the event consisted above all in the request **to give more space to moments of confrontation and debate between partners**. The themes that emerged with greater force to be explored in future debates concern the forms of financing of these housing models and the social aspects of cohousing (composition of cohousing, creation of the group of cohousers, benefits of these forms of housing).
